



The “Swing to [Re]Build” Golf Tournament Returns on Monday, September 30, 2024

Rebuilding Together Peninsula hosts its fourth annual golf tournament fundraiser this fall

Rebuilding Together Peninsula’s annual golf fundraising tournament, “Swing to [Re]Build” returns to Stanford Golf Course on the campus of Stanford University on Monday, September 30, 2024. As in previous years, the tournament will benefit local non-profit Rebuilding Together Peninsula’s year-round home repair programs. Provided at no cost to recipients, these services allow San Francisco Peninsula residents to live, learn, work, thrive and age in place with dignity in a safe and healthy home.

This year’s tournament also falls on the eve of the organization’s 35th anniversary. Since 1989, Rebuilding Together Peninsula has serviced more than 3,500 homes and 400 community facilities across San Mateo County and northern Santa Clara County with critical safety-related repairs.

"We're thrilled to be back at Stanford's premier course to continue the tradition of "swinging to rebuild", said Rebuilding Together Peninsula Executive Director, Melissa Lukin. "This tournament is a great capstone for our 35th anniversary year providing safety and health-related repairs for vulnerable homeowners. We are so grateful for our sponsors' investment in RTP and in helping preserve affordable home ownership on the Peninsula."

The previous three tournaments, held in 2022 at Sharon Heights Golf and Country Club in Menlo Park, CA, in 2021 at Half Moon Bay Golf Links at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel in Half Moon Bay, Ca, and last year at Stanford Golf Course, brought in more than \$850,000 combined to support Rebuilding Together Peninsula's work.
